

## Gradbøjning af tillægsord

Der er to måder at gradbøje tillægsord på. Man sætter **-er/-est** på eller **more/most** foran.

Ved de fleste enstavelsesord og nogle tostavelsesord bøjer man med **-er/-est**.

Husk at tillægsordet i nogle tilfælde ændrer sig ved gradbøjningen:

- Susan's party was fancy, but Joe's was fancier.

2. grad	She is smarter than me.
3. grad	She is the smartest one.

Alle tillægsord med **tre eller flere stavelser** bøjes med **more** og **most**:

1. grad		This flower is beautiful
2. grad	more	This flower is more beautiful
3. grad	most	This is the most beautiful flower
